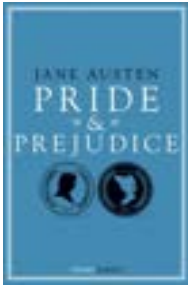

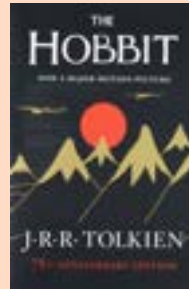
Pride and Prejudice by Jane Austen

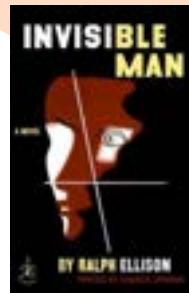
The Outsiders by S.E. Hinton

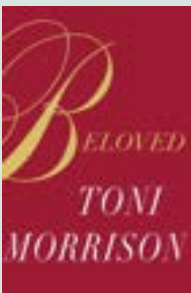
Invisible Man by Ralph Ellison

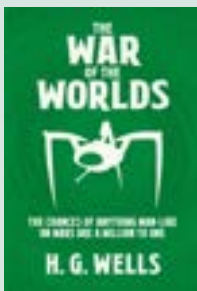
Beloved by Toni Morrison

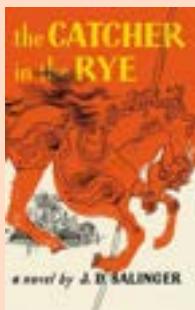

A 16-year-old American boy relates in his own words the experiences he goes through at school and after, and reveals with unusual candour the workings of his own mind.

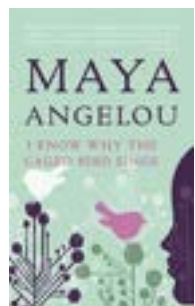

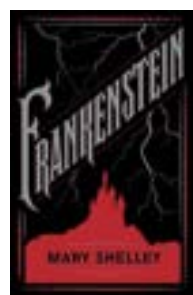
