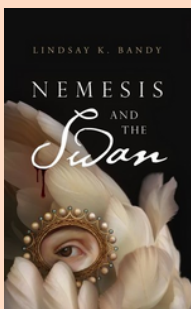
Angel of Greenwood by Randi Pink

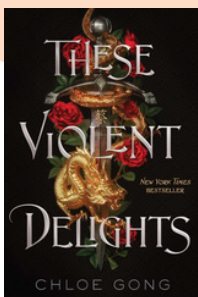
Nemesis and the Swan by Lindsay K. Bandy

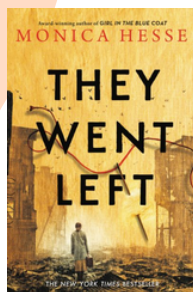
Beautiful Wild by Anna Godbersen

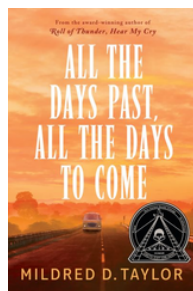
They Went Left by Monica Hesse

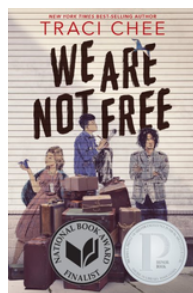
All the Days Past, All the Days To Come by Mildred D. Taylor

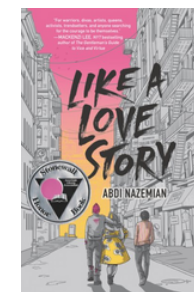
The Boy in the Red Dress by Kristin Lambert

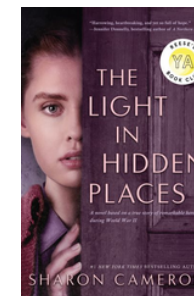
Like a Love Story by Abdi Nazemian
